

# Standard of Forgiveness: God's Forgiveness

Ephesians 4:32 (ESV)

Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.

## Standard of Forgiveness: God's Forgiveness

- Man's Greatest Need
- God's Greatest Gift
- Because God has forgiven us of ALL OUR SINS, we have the power AND responsibility to forgive EVERYONE who sins against us.

1. When you are the one who sinned (Matthew 5:23-24)

"So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift." (ESV)

- 1. When you are the one who sinned (Matthew 5:23-24)
  - Confess
  - Repent
  - Make Right
  - Basically...Ask for Forgiveness!

- 1. When you are the one who sinned (Matthew 5:23-24)
- 2. When you are the one sinned against (Luke 17:3-10)

- <sup>3</sup> Pay attention to yourselves!
  - "If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him.

    4 and if he sins against you seven times in the day, and turns to you seven times saying, 'I repent,' you must forgive him."
- <sup>5</sup> The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!"
- <sup>6</sup> And the Lord said, "If you had faith like a grain of mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.

#### Luke 17:3-10 (ESV)

- <sup>7</sup> "Will any one of you who has a servant plowing or keeping sheep say to him when he has come in from the field, 'Come at once and recline at table'?
- <sup>8</sup> Will he not rather say to him, 'Prepare supper for me, and dress properly, and serve me while I eat and drink, and afterward you will eat and drink'?
- <sup>9</sup> Does he thank the servant because he did what was commanded?
- <sup>10</sup> So you also, when you have done all that you were commanded, say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done what was our duty.'"

#### Luke 17:3-10 (ESV)

- 1. When you are the one who sinned (Matthew 5:23-24)
- 2. When you are the one sinned against (Luke 17:3-10)
  - Difficulty #1: "If your brother sins, rebuke him."

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#### Luke 17:3-10

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  - Difficulty #2: "If he repents, forgive him."

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"Concealing debt, removing guilt, and promising that you will *never again* bring up the offences to *use against* the other person."



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Heart forgiveness includes identifying with the wrongdoer, inwardly paying the debt, and then willing good for the wrongdoer. (Keller)

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- "I don't have to forgive if the other person doesn't ask me for forgiveness."
- Forgiveness = Reconciliation

## Forgiveness vs. Reconciliation

"There are not two kinds of forgiveness but two aspects or stages of it. One could say that the first must always happen, and the second may happen but is not always possible. Attitudinal forgiveness can occur without reconciliation, but reconciliation cannot happen unless attitudinal forgiveness has already occurred."

Forgiveness can take place with only one person

**Reconciliation** requires the involvement of two persons.

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**Forgiveness** is a decision to release the person who harmed you

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**Reconciliation** is the effort to rejoin to the person who harmed you.

Forgiveness is a decision to release the person who harmed you. Forgiveness involves a change in thinking about the offender.

**Reconciliation** requires the involvement of two persons.

**Reconciliation** is the effort to rejoin to the person who harmed you.

**Reconciliation** involves a change in behavior by the offender.

**Forgiveness** is a gift to the one who has broken trust.

**Reconciliation** is a restored relationship based on trust.

**Forgiveness** is a gift to the one who has broken trust.


**Forgiveness** is extended even if it is never earned.

**Reconciliation** is a restored relationship based on trust.

**Reconciliation** is offered to the offender because it has been earned.
